THE NEW THEATRE

The renovation of the world's famous TCL Chinese Theatre (formerly Grauman's Chinese Theatre) was recently completed in Hollywood, California. The transformation has made it Hollywood's first IMAX theatre. The TCL Chinese Theatre now boasts an impressive stadium seating of 932, making it the largest IMAX auditorium in the world in terms of seating capacity and third largest commercial theatre in North America.



The historical value to the Hollywood scene was not forgotten when considering the renovation and scope of the entire venue. The theatre's world renowned forecourt is home to over 200 celebrity hand and footprints, which could not be removed for construction access. In addition to limited access, the TCL Chinese theatre was declared a national historic landmark in 1968. Therefore, the auditorium walls and ceiling had to be protected and remain unaltered.



Moorefield Construction proudly completed the project within the 100 day projected timeline. TCL Chinese theatre after closing for the summer 2013, reopened Sunday, September 15th, 2013 with the premiere of *The Wizard of Oz* 75th anniversary in IMAX 3D.
